

As we head into an exciting time of the year, full of reflection and celebrations, we want to express our deepest gratitude for our Kindergarten scholars and families! We are so thankful that you are a part of our Kindergarten family!



- Please remember to read the agenda book nightly and sign that you
 have seen it. This is a great way for communication to occur between home and school!
- Please update the extra clothes that are in your scholar's bookbag in case of accidents! Now that it is cold outside, we want to make sure these extra clothes are seasonally appropriate.
- We are looking forward to welcoming families into the building for our Kindergarten Learn with Me Event on Friday, December 16th, 2022 from 10:00AM-11:00AM to celebrate the gift of reading!! Be on the lookout for more information from your scholar's classroom teacher!
- Word Scientists: Scholars will independently use their learning to identify letters and letter sounds, use their knowledge of letter-sounds to begin to segment words in reading, incorporate letter knowledge in writing, and identify and write SNAP words to incorporate in their reading and writing.

Reading: Sharing Reading: Scholars will begin to track print (one touch for one word) and use SNAP words to help them read. We will work with reading partners to help use comprehend our books. **Writing:** Show and Tell: Scholars will get more and more down on their paper! We are hoping to build lots of inventive spellers in our classroom! We want to fill our pages with not just pictures but also words!

Mathematics: Topic 4: Compare Numbers 0 to 10: Mathematicians will compare and order numbers 0 to 10. Topic 5: Classify and Count Data: Mathematicians will classify data to answer questions. **TUB:** Communities: Scholars will explore what makes a community successful.

We are looking forward to a month full of festivities with our scholars! Stay warm!

1st Grade

First graders have been working so hard as we begin the second quarter of school together! We are looking forward to the December and the excitement that the season brings! We are beginning to move into new content in our curricular calendar as we enter December! In math, we are beginning Topic 4, Subtraction to 20! As writers, we will be thinking about our knowledge of the world around us as we begin to write non-fiction teaching books! In Phonics, we will be working on "cases" and



trying to solve the mystery of the silent e at the end of words and how that tiny silent letter can change

the sound of the whole word! In Reading Workshop, we will be Word Detectives and use all we know about vowels, blends and digraphs to help us read unknown words!

As a grade level, we would like to remind all parents/guardians of the following:

- Please make sure that your child has a coat, as we have recess outside twice daily. If you need assistance in getting a coat for your child, please reach out to your child's teacher.
- Please make sure to pack your child an extra set of clothing in their backpacks.
- ALL money coming to school should be in a ziplock bag and labeled with your child's name and the purpose of the money.
- Please make sure to initial your child's agenda each evening, as this is the primary communication tool between school and home! Check your child's teacher's communication platform (ClassTag, Dojo, etc.) for updates, reminders and notifications of upcoming events!

- We will be going outside every day so please make sure your child is prepared with hats, gloves, jackets, scarves, and anything that will keep them warm for our time outside!

 send your child to school with the appropriate outdoor clothing. If
 you need assistance with winter outdoor wear, please reach out to
 your child's teacher.

- Quick reminder: If your child is absent, please send a note for the absence on the day he/she returns to school.


Special Areas-Intermediate
