Message from Principal Wooden

Welcome to 2023! Happy New Year to all of our families! It is my WISH that 2023 is good to all of us. As we get this next half of the school year on our way, please make sure:



- · Scholar's shoes are tied
- Scholars get plenty of rest in order to learn each and every day
- · Scholars stay home if they are feeling ill
- Scholars spend time with you reviewing school expectations

These things will help us tremendously as we try our best to focus on teaching and learning.

As you know, during the winter months, we tend to have inclement weather. At times, the weather causes schools to close or require us to start later or leave earlier. Please be sure to watch the news to keep informed of the impact that inclement weather might have on schools.

During our first three snow days, students will participate in asynchronous (learning at your own pace) learning experiences. These learning experiences will require students to be engaged in reading, math, and unified arts (PE, art, media, or music).

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) approved the HCPS application to conduct asynchronous virtual instruction on up to 3 inclement weather days. HCPS staff are diligently working to prepare a "practice" of what this will look like. **That practice is scheduled for the evening of Monday, January 9, 2023**. Prekindergarten students will receive a bag of supplies when the bags are delivered. Students in kindergarten through grade 12 will bring their device home January 9, 2023; as part of their homework, they must log into their inclement weather tile, which will appear on Canvas, and send a confirmation message to the teacher. The HCPS curriculum office is creating the assignment that every single student will do that will be a quick confirmation that they were able to get in.



Please note, if there is a need to close HCPS for inclement weather **PRIOR** to January 9, 2023, we will **NOT** utilize virtual instruction. Following the practice on the evening of January 9, 2023, HCPS plans to conduct asynchronous virtual instruction on the first 3 closures for inclement weather.



This will be available prior to the January 9, 2022, scheduled "practice."

As we plan for asynchronous days, we will be sure that time is provided for students and families to play in the snow. We do not want to take that experience away from our kiddos or families. Snow days are memorable days for kiddos and families.
