PRE-K

as we build sets and explore addition and subtraction with in 5. Pre-K will have their End of the Year Celebration on June 9, 2023 from 12:30-1:30. Look for more specific information in the upcoming weeks from your child's teacher.

KINDERGARTEN

Phonics: Playing with Phonics: Scholars will be able to independently use their learning to "teach" others about the many phonics skills they have learned throughout the school year.
